

The Point Ritchie-Moyjil quiz - Answers

- 1. What does Moyjil, the Aboriginal name for Point Ritchie, mean? Long drag net or fishing basket
- 2. What is a midden?

Refuse from human activity such as food consumption or preparation. In the case of Point Ritchie-Moyjil there are extensive shell middens among nearby dunes and within the geological layers of the rocky headland.

 Can you name one of the dating techniques being used at Moyjil? Optically stimulated luminescence and radio carbon dating have been used to try and date the archaeological material at Moyjil.

4. What is tuff?

Geological material comprising volcanic ash, which at Moyjil has come from the eruptions at Tower Hill.

- 5. How long does calcrete take to form? Calcrete takes 30,000 to 40,000 years to form. Calcrete is formed from calcium carbonate which is the material contained in shells.
- 6. How long ago did Tower Hill erupt? The initial eruptions are thought to have been about 30,000 to 35,000 years ago.
- 7. What is the name of the shell commonly found in the middens at Moyjil? The wavy turbo. It's scientific name is Turbo undulatus
- 8. What is the name of the Aboriginal nation whose territory includes Moyjil? Gunditjmara.
- 9. Moyjil is in which Victorian coastal city? Warrnambool.
- 10. What are the branches of science which are helping tell the story of Moyjil? Archaeologists and geologists are interested in helping unlock the secrets of Moyjil.
- 11. For how long do some scientists think Moyjil has been inhabited by people? Perhaps 60,000 to 80,000 years.
- What special protection has been applied to the site? An Ongoing Protection Declaration had been made for the site – including shell middens. This is the highest level of protection available of Aboriginal heritage protection available. Point Ritchie-Moyjil is also listed on the Victorian Aboriginal Heritage Register.

- 13. What is the name of the river at Moyjil? The Hopkins River.
- 14. What is the name of the ocean that lies to the south of Moyjil? The Southern Ocean.
- 15. What is a glacial period? An ice age or a period of time in which the earth is considerably cooler and the extent of the polar caps is much greater and there are more glaciers.

16. What is an interglacial period? A time between glacial periods when the earth is warmer.

- 17. Are sea levels higher or lower during a glacial period? Sea levels are lower during a glacial period with more of the earth's water locked up in the polar ice caps.
- Name the Warrnambool naturalist who sparked modern scientific interest in Point Ritchie as an Aboriginal site of significance. Jim Henry.
- 19. Why are scientists cautious about declaring with absolute certainty that Point Ritchie-Moyjil is the oldest Aboriginal site in Australia? There remains a possibility that the shell deposits were not made by humans although there is little doubt that more recent shell aggregations are evidence of human activity.
- 20. In more recent Aboriginal history, what type of fish was an important food source in the Hopkins River? The short-finned eel.
